# Beyond OUR Borders:

## Mission Trip to Ecuador



We celebrate one of the most impactful experiences that define a MA student's journey - our domestic and international mission trips. This year, we enthusiastically resumed this adventure after a four-year hiatus caused by the pandemic. A dedicated group of almost 30 students, alumni, and chaperones embarked on a remarkable journey, venturing just a few miles north of the equator.

Our destination was the *Hacienda of Hope*, nestled in the Andes in Ecuador, more than 10,000 feet above sea level. For nearly two decades, the *Hacienda of Hope* has been a significant part of our mission trips. This world-class child care program, proudly sponsored by the *Twickenham Church of Christ* in Huntsville, serves as a loving home to more than 40 children who have triumphed over abandonment and abuse. Additionally, the *Hacienda of Hope Christian Academy* extends its benevolent reach to approximately 250 community children.

Our dedicated team's mission was centered on engaging with students from the HOH Academy and a local, underprivileged school nestled a few kilometers up the majestic mountain. Our students and accompanying adults conducted skits, imparted knowledge through teaching, and indulged in creative arts and crafts with nearly 400 students from these two schools.

As our team embraced the heartwarming experience of this remarkable journey, they had the opportunity to immerse themselves in the breathtaking landscapes and unique culture of Ecuador. They ventured through the world-renowned Otavalo Market, explored the wonders of the Middle of the World Museum in Quito, danced to the rhythms of salsa, and scaled the spire of a magnificent gothic basilica. Just outside their villa, which served as their home for a week, a mesmerizing view of Mount Cayambe graced their presence - the sole snow-capped peak right on the equator. What an awe-inspiring sight!

These mission trips are not just journeys, but life-altering experiences that instill a sense of purpose, compassion, and global awareness in our students. We eagerly look forward to continuing our tradition of reaching out and making a positive impact on the world in the years to come.



*Open to grades 10 through 12, our mission trips make a dramatic impact on students' lives by getting them out of their "first-world bubble" to experience a different culture and to see life through a different lens. Participants are encouraged to let their guards down to allow God's Spirit to open their eyes and hearts to their potential roles in life and the plan He has for them.*

## Campus Renovations

In our ongoing commitment to enhance the appearance, functionality, and safety of MA's facilities and campus, we have taken strategic steps this year. We are pleased to highlight several significant initiatives that have contributed to these improvements.

One of the noteworthy accomplishments was the complete restoration of a 90,000 square foot roof, a critical project that ensures the structural integrity and longevity of our facilities. Furthermore, we undertook the exterior painting of the upper school and elementary buildings, rejuvenating their aesthetic appeal. To bolster safety on campus, we also invested in new lighting installations, providing a secure and well-illuminated environment. Our heartfelt gratitude goes out to the generous contributions from members of our MA family and Parents' Association, whose support has been instrumental in making these enhancements possible.

Continuing our commitment to campus improvements, we have addressed other aspects of our facilities. This includes refurbishing hallway flooring, playground improvements, retreading stairwells, and replacing our gutter and downspout systems. Many of our athletic facilities received a much needed face lift with more planned in the future.

These efforts demonstrate our dedication to provide a safe, conducive, and aesthetically pleasing campus that fosters an optimal learning and extracurricular environment for our students. We remain committed to ongoing improvements and development to further enrich the MA experience.

## Security Upgrades

The safety and security of our MA community always remain our highest priority. Our Safety and Security Team is made up of administrators, directors of facilities and grounds, medical faculty and off-site consultants. It is our primary mission to comprehensively review and enhance our campus safety protocols, procedures, and training initiatives. We continually assess and improve what more we can do to maintain the utmost safety within our school environment.

In our pursuit of providing a secure environment, we collaborated with security experts who bring a wealth of experience to the table. This includes professionals such as a Federal Bureau of Investigation Special Agent, a Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives Special Agent, a United States Active Duty Military and Counter-Terrorism Expert, Huntsville Police Department Officers, and many more. Our collective goal is to "Prevent, Protect, and Prepare" our MA families against any potential harm while they are under our care.

Immediate improvements to the security on campus, including additional surveillance cameras, ongoing safety training for students, faculty, and staff, visitor management equipment, and secure enhancements to our building entry points including new doors and protective laminate, and a guard post and fencing to have one main entry point during school hours.

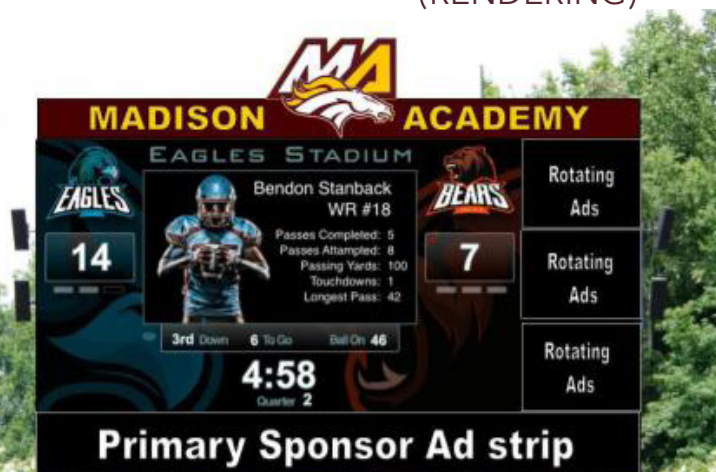

However, as time passed, it became evident that our jumbotron and scoreboard were in need of an upgrade. This past summer, we took the exciting step of replacing them with state-of-the-art technology, including a new jumbotron and gymbotron, enhancing the experiences at Bill Washington Stadium and the Jack Kelly gymnasium. With over 1,300 square feet of HD video board, these dazzling displays not only elevate the spectator experience for our various sports events, but also provide an opportunity to generate future revenue which will play a vital role in impacting our students' education and experiences for years to come.
